Message for Easter from Deacon Rick.

Happy Easter to one and all! What a joyous time of the year. With the long hard winter we just all went through and the coming of spring, we get that feeling of a new beginning. We have walked the path of Jesus through this lent and Holy Week to celebrate his Glorious Resurrection; which reinforces our hope in the one true God, our Lord and Savior, Christ Jesus.

Over the past three weeks of my time here, I have also been working on some new beginnings. The convent has a new hot water heater and the school kitchen has new faucets. You may have seen scaffolding in the church. We have painters working to repair past water damage, which gives us a fresh new look where we were flaking away. We even replaced lights that were illuminating the ceiling of the sanctuary that had been burnt out for many years. This past week, we have signed off on the transfer of the St. Adalbert's rectory to the Pro-Life office of the Diocese, for their use in living out the prolife message by our actions in support of life – not just in our words. We see these outward signs of new beginnings as an indication of inward new beginnings in our future.

On Divine Mercy Sunday, the Holy Father, Pope Francis, is issuing a declaration of a Holy Year dedicated to 'God's Mercy'. We want to be a part of that prayerful time to ask for God's Mercy to aid all those who are being persecuted for their faith in Jesus. The need for Mercy is not just in the Middle East, but it is needed everywhere; wherever evil has found a home. I look forward to any suggestions that you may have in the observance of this Holy Year. We will be hearing more about this from the diocese in the coming weeks.

I thank you for the warm welcome you have shown me in my assignment here. My door is always open to your comments and suggestions in ways which we can build up the body of Christ.

They did not yet understand that he had to rise from the dead. More than two millennia later, we too do not always find Jesus where we expect him to be. Instead, Jesus comes to us, sometimes in unexpected ways, even as he did for Mary of Magdala, Peter, John and the other disciples. For now, keep seeking Jesus and trust that, even if we do not find him where we expect to, he will always find us. Have Blessed Easter.
